## Celebrating 30 Years of Community Leadership and Lasting Impact

This year marks the 30th anniversary of a defining moment in our community's history: the formation of the Joint Powers Agreement, which officially established the Belvedere Tiburon Library as an independent institution. It was a bold move led by local visionaries who believed the peninsula deserved a library shaped by community needs, values, and dreams.

Thanks to their leadership and the ongoing support of many generous donors, volunteers, and neighbors, the library has grown into a vital community hub. We cut the ribbon on our building in 1997 and, in 2022, completed a significant renovation and expansion to meet the evolving needs of the

### Library Art Gallery

When out of town guests visit, showing off the Gallery at the Belvedere Tiburon Library has become a point of pride for 94920 residents. Heading into our fourth year of delightfully-curated exhibitions that draw significant and emerging artists from all over the Bay Area, our shows and affiliated programming—ARTalks, Gallery Chats and Meet the Artists—are squarely a part of the cultural eco-system in Marin.

Volunteers do the vast majority of work that powers the Gallery. Countless hours go into choosing the art work, hanging, marketing, and holding events. In supporting and showcasing artists, we provide them much needed exposure. In addition, the Gallery team selects themes that resonate with our community, the most recent being Art Inspired by Literature, a marriage of art and the printed word fitting for a library gallery. 


