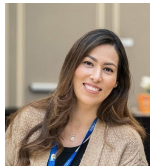
## Director's Message, Continued

## Library Board Service Opportunity

The Belvedere Tiburon Library is governed by a seven-member Library Board that provides policy direction and supports long-range planning. The Board meets monthly on the third Monday at 6:15 pm.

An upcoming vacancy must be filled by a Tiburon resident. Board members serve four-year terms and help guide policies that shape library services for the community. We welcome interest from individuals who can help strengthen diverse representation on the Library Board and support the Library's commitment to inclusion and equitable access. A range of perspectives helps ensure decisions reflect the needs and experiences of the broader community.

This vacancy will be appointed by the Town of Tiburon Council. Interested Tiburon residents are encouraged to submit an application through the Town in June. Individuals who would like to learn more about the opportunity are encouraged to contact the Library Director.

We extend sincere appreciation to outgoing Trustee Jeff Slavitz for his years of meaningful service to the Library Board. Jeff brought financial expertise, sound judgment, and an approachable, collaborative spirit. His contributions strengthened the Library's long-term fiscal health, including improvements to reserve and investment policies, progress in retiring library debt, and careful stewardship that will benefit the organization for years to come.

Our four-week Robotics Challenge is designed for students in 6th grade and above who want to move beyond basic blocks and into the world of smart engineering.

From solving complex mazes to the ultimate Battle Bot showdown, you'll use Archie, our Vibe Coding Assistant, to master real-world engineering challenges.

Using the versatile BBC Micro: bit, the SparkFun Moto: bit motor controller, and the ElecFreaks Joy: bit game controller, you will build a custom robot and put it through its paces in a series of increasingly difficult missions.

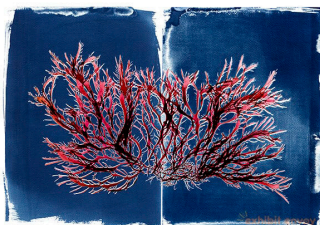
